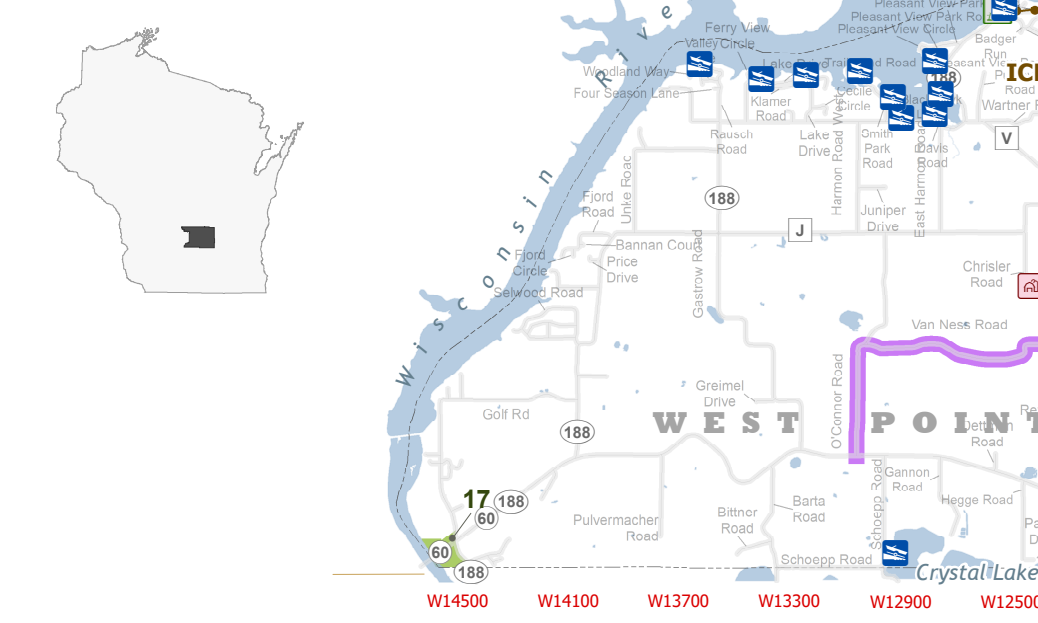
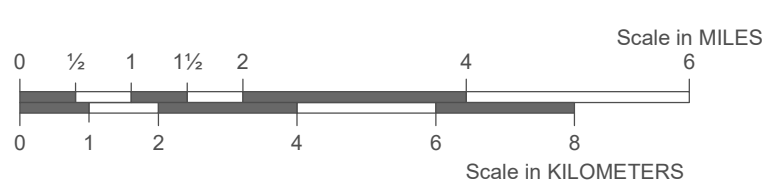


PUBLIC RECREATION LANDS AND PARKS
 US Fish and Wildlife Service Waterfowl Production Areas (WPA) and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource public lands are open to hunting, trapping, and fishing and are subject to all applicable Federal and State laws. Exceptions to this rule are the Mackenzie Environmental Center and State Game Farm and lands that are posted with "Closed to Public Hunting" signs. Area WDNR Service Center is located at the Mackenzie Center, W7303 County Hwy CS (Poynette).

All areas are open to wildlife observation, hiking, cross-country skiing, nature study, and photography.

RUSTIC ROADS

The Rustic Roads System in Wisconsin was created to help preserve what remains of Wisconsin's scenic, lightly traveled country roads. These routes provide bikers, hikers, and motorists with an opportunity to leisurely travel the scenic countryside. Unique brown and yellow signs mark the routes of all officially designated Rustic Roads. A small placard beneath the Rustic Roads sign identifies each Rustic Road by its numerical designation within the total statewide system.

Rustic Road 69 (Old Agency House Road) - Travels along the historic Portage Canal. On one side of the road are wetlands that serve as a habitat for sandhill cranes, blue heron, and many other birds. The road leads to the historic Indian Agency House (circa 1832) where it connects with the Ice Age National Scenic Trail. One can also view the remnants of the Old Fort Winnebago Locks. This canal joined the Fox and Wisconsin Rivers, making travel by water possible for the first time from the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico.

ICE AGE NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL SEGMENTS

The Ice Age Trail relies heavily on the support of private landowners. Please respect their rights and stay on the trail at all times!

The Ice Age Trail is one of eight Congressionally designated National Scenic Trails located throughout the United States. The trail follows the terminal moraine left by the glacier over 10,000 years ago. Both the Lodi Marsh and the Portage Canal and Marquette Segments of the Ice Age Trail offer visitors an excellent place from which to view and experience Wisconsin's spectacularly diverse glacial landscape.

The Ice Age Trail is primarily for hiking, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing. Other types of activities such as biking, horseback riding or snowmobiling are allowed only where clearly marked. Fires and camping are only allowed in designated areas. The Ice Age Trail is closed during deer gun season. Please use caution and wear bright colors during all other hunting seasons.
